

About Abbott Corners Opioid Treatment Program

We opened our Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) at the Abbott Corners Clinic January 9th 2019. At this location, we provide integrated substance use disorder and mental health counseling. Our focus is treating opioid use disorder with medications we are licensed to dispense at the office (i.e., methadone, buprenorphine). We work with people one-on-one and in groups on various areas of need, to include substance use, posttraumatic stress disorder, anxiety, depression, stress management and major life changes. We offer different services at our clinic to help add to your treatment. This includes Medication Management for Substance Use Disorders, Medication Management for mental health disorders, Peer Support Services, Psychiatric Rehabilitation Services (vocational and educational assistance), Targeted Case Management and Health Monitoring (nursing/medical services). If there is something that we do not offer that you think would help you in your recovery, our staff would be happy to refer you elsewhere to get that extra support.

We are open:

Monday thru Friday (Dispensing/Dosing): 7:00am – 1:00pm Saturday & Sunday (Dispensing/Dosing): 7:00am – 11:00am Monday thru Thursday (other services): 7:00am – 8:00pm Fridays (other services): 7:00am – 5:00pm

Holidays:

We are closed on some holidays and take-home medication will be dispensed a day in advance of closing. If one of these holidays falls on a Saturday, we will be closed that Friday. If it falls on a Sunday, we will be closed the following Monday. All patients are advised to obtain a locking box to safely store take-home medication. The clinic will be closed on:
