## CONSIDERING UNLIMITED PTO? KEEP THESE THINGS IN MIND.

Since opening in 2015, StaffBuffalo LLC has offered unlimited paid time off for employees.

It's worked for the recruitment firm, which employs 19, said partner and co-founder Lauren Lewis.

"We never saw employees abusing it," she said. "In positions I've held in the past, I wouldn't want to take a halfday for something like a doctor's appointment that came up. I would want to save that PTO for a true vacation and recharge."

That's the key to unlimited PTO. It's more about having flexibility when life happens.

Some highly recognizable businesses offer their employees unlimited time off: Netflix, Oracle, Zoom, Salesforce, Adobe. "The hiring market is tough right now, so this is an extra benefit to offer new employees," Lewis said. "If an employee has to leave a couple hours early for an appointment or to see their kid's kindergarten graduation, they don't have to worry about it cutting into their PTO."

Still, there are factors employers need to consider before switching to unlimited PTO. First, it takes a lot of planning and communication among the various teams.

"You have to know how to manage it appropriately as an employer and an employee," Lewis said.

That's why, with unlimited PTO, managers or supervisors should check in regularly with staff to make sure they are taking the time off they need without hurting productivity. ▲ Lauren Lewis, partner and co-founder, StaffBuffalo And while employers and managers can deny time off requests, even in an unlimited PTO setup, it's "probably not a good look" to do that, Lewis said.

"You don't want to have to be in that position," Lewis said. "So you really have to keep communication open around time off, performance and workload."

Especially for smaller teams, she said, employees may need to request time off further in advance to ensure there isn't a lot of overlapping.

"You want to make sure the work is still getting done," Lewis said. "You still want to make sure you're providing the same standard of service to your clients and customers."

It depends on the industry, too.

"Manufacturing could be

more difficult, because they have to make sure the machines are running, and they have a certain benchmark for product going out," she said.

As StaffBuffalo has grown, Lewis said, she has had some employees prefer a more structured approach to PTO.

"For some people, if you have a set amount of PTO, you're more likely to strategize how to use it throughout the year," Lewis said.

"Sometimes, if they take a chunk of it at a time, it feels like too much," she said. "You find that people further along in their career know how to manage their workload and make sure the work is still getting done a little better in comparison with a younger employee or someone new to an organization."

## CHARLIE HUNT STEPS IN AS THE 4TH GENERATION

Coming into a leadership role as the fourth generation of a 112-year-old family business brings with it a bit of pressure, and certainly expectations.

Charles "Charlie" Hunt spent the last 20 years preparing for his new role as president of the residential brokerage at Hunt Real Estate Corp., where he's also COO for the entire company.

**Title:** Hunt Real Estate Corp. chief operating officer, president of residential brokerage

Fact about Hunt Real Estate: The company recorded just under 14,000 transactions last year

What keeps you up at night? Right now, it's the transitioning market and the industry as a whole transitioning. We are a very mature industry that's still going through changes every day. You just never know what's next.

Favorite superhero? Iron Man

He has recognized that there are resources out there to help him gain the skills he needs. That's what led him to connect with a leadership coach three years ago whose roster of clients includes Fortune 500 executives.

"It's made me a lot more thoughtful in my decision-making, less reactive and probably helped with some maturation," Hunt said.

Despite his family legacy, Charlie didn't plan on a career in real estate. He got his first paycheck for data entry work at the company at 16 – somewhat reluctantly – a job he took after breaking his collarbone.

"I couldn't play hockey and had to find something," he said.

While studying management at Bentley University, he had the chance to get licensed in real estate as part of a law class. By 20 he was doing residential deals on the side.

After college, he moved to Sarasota, Florida, to work for the family business as a real estate agent and moved back to Buffalo in 2011 to become branch manager, regional manager, VP and director of corporate relations. He became COO in 2017.

As president of the residential brokerage, Charlie, 39, oversees 62 branch offices in New York, Arizona and Massachusetts. The COO job includes oversight of residential and commercial, as well as affiliated companies that provide mortgage, insurance, title services and property management. The team totals 320 employees plus 1,800 independent contractor sellers.

His father, Peter Hunt, who is chairman and CEO, remains a major resource, but Charlie also looks to leaders outside the company including those through the Young Presidents Organization, Hunt Real Estate's advisory board and an informal group of peers around town.

His goal is to continue to grow the company by expanding and retaining its seller base and through mergers and acquisitions, all areas affected by the pandemic.

"New people in the business did have a difficult time. If you've never sold a house before and that first one has 14 offers, it's a steep learning curve. It's tough to teach that sort of on-the-ground, in-the-middle-of-the-fight until you get into it," he said.

"There's natural attrition in this business with retirements, relocations," he said. "People pass away and people just get out of the business. So you have to constantly replace those people."

When it comes to growing the company through acquisitions, the deals have to make sense.

"There are acquisition opportunities all around us, someone with an existing business a town over," he said. "Or we see opportunities and growth in a marketplace where we would like a physical location."

## **MIGHTY TACO'S COMPETITION? 'OURSELVES.'**

The CEO of Mighty Taco isn't worried about competition, despite a push into the region by Taco Bell and at least 10 Mexican restaurants opening in the last two years.

The Buffalo taco shop has managed to survive and thrive, opening its 19th location this spring at 5752 Transit Road, Depew.

"Our biggest competition is ourselves," said CEO Russ Jasulevich.

Since its founding in 1973 by four friends, Mighty Taco has stuck to the basics: handhelds such as tacos, burritos and fajitas; seasonal specials like barbecued pulled pork in summer; chili in the fall; fish tacos in the spring during Lent; and the chic-kle – a chicken breast taco with dill pickle.

brought (a founder's) mother's recipes to the Western New York region where at one point there was very little to no Mexican-style food," Jasulevich said when the first Mighty Taco opened at Hertel and Delaware.

Jasulevich's favorite? A classic bean and cheese burrito. He said a team of five brainstorm ideas to see what sticks.

"We brought it out as a limited time only special a year and a half ago and it went so well and demand was so good that once we were able to get the product again, we relaunched it and we believe it will stay on the menu now," he said.

Three years ago, Mighty Taco added alcohol to the in-store "Believe it or not, they | menu with beer and seltzer.

With new rules adopted during the pandemic, those drinks can also be included in delivery orders, providing a nice enhancement to revenue, he said.

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A few years ago, the company began flash-freezing burritos and shipping them and bottled hot sauce via truck or air in coolers packed with dry ice.

Though Jasulevich wouldn't discuss revenue or percentage growth, business is strong enough to support all expansion with zero loans and zero debt.

"The company is doing well and continues to do well," he said. "It does so well that all renovations, new construction and capital infusion come from cash flow from operations."

Jasulevich joined the company 15 years ago when there were about a dozen stores in the chain, leaving behind a career in hotel finance and accounting as well as a beachfront house in Santa Barbara to take over operations.

A Buffalo native who attended Niagara University, he left the region 25 years ago.

"I was living right on a cliff overlooking the ocean, listening to the whales swim by. I missed the snow," he said. "I got a phone call from someone who knew one of the owners and ended up back here. It was a mighty good decision."

The Depew store is the third to open since the pandemic, following a move of the Sheridan Drive store to a new location and a new standalone site in Orchard Park. Some sites have closed including the Buffalo site on Chippewa during the pandemic.

All stores are company owned and operated with about 400 on payroll. Jasulevich said the customer base is young people looking for a quick, inexpensive meal but also families.

"It's something you grow up on," he said. "We see photos of parents taking their kids, giving them their first taste of Mighty. And when people leave Buffalo and they come back, there has to be a Mighty stop.

## Whole Health Buffalo: Employers need policies to support workers in recovery

eff Fyvie's career path was unimaginable as he stashed bottles of beer in the toilet tank of the restaurant he co-owned.

These days Fyvie is Director of Peer Services at BestSelf Behavioral Health.

He is both an example for those working to overcome substance use problems and an example of a valuable employee in recovery.

Fyvie oversees the staff at BestSelf who are certified peer specialists. These are people who have lived experience in substance use, mental health or psychological trauma and are trained to support others enduring these challenges. They offer personal insight and expertise that cannot be taught in any degree program or professional training.

BestSelf employs 50 peer specialists throughout the agency across Western New York.

Their message is, "I've been in a situation similar to yours and I can help you find a way out," Fyvie says.

His lived experience dates to developing a drinking problem and becoming a father at age 17, a situation that escalated to include drug use.

In his mid-20s, Fyvie was invited by a boss to open a restaurant, beer and wine license included. Over the course of the 26 years as a restaurateur, he would indulge his alcohol use in part by slipping bottles of beer into the compartments of his cargo pants and hiding them in the bathroom.

He tried to reassure himself that he was in control by telling himself, "I'm married. I have a family and a restaurant. I must be doing OK."

Fyvie operated like this for years, until his wife confronted him and encouraged him to be honest about his behavior.

He entered Alcoholics Anonymous and latched on to peer support services while dealing with the personal struggle of leaving the restaurant business that he helped build and make a success. Impressed by the assistance he got from his peer counselor, he entered into training to become one himself.

Fyvie finished training just a month before Covid hit, but he managed to build a base of

participants during the challenges of the pandemic. After nearly three years, he proved to be such an asset as a peer supporter that BestSelf promoted him to director.

BestSelf leadership is hopeful that more employers similarly will support such workers in recovery.

Despite some advancements, stigma against workers with lived experience remains, Lindsey Rickard, Vice President of Training and Access Optimization, said.

Recovery is the lifelong process in which the person strives to improve and make positive changes that become part of his or her lifestyle, according to the National Institute on Drug Abuse.

BestSelf encourages connections with employers concerned about their workers' mental health and recovery in the workplace.

"We can help businesses with policies and linkages to resources," Rickard said. "When preventative measures are in place and they see someone struggling, they will know what to do."

Fyvie says that corporate America is taking steps to improve the stigma of mental health, as evidenced by the increasing number of major companies adding employee assistance programs and health insurance policies that address mental health problems.

Those companies could go even further by employing and supporting those actively working through recovery, Fyvie said.

This aligns with National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health recommendations that businesses consider a Workplace Recovery Support program. Such programs involve policies and training for supervisors and employees that address worker safety, health and wellness while preventing substance misuse, reducing stigma and encouraging further recovery.

It would seem to be an imperative across employers: Twothirds of all adults with alcohol or illicit drug use disorder have jobs, according to a 2020 survey by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

Fyvie says employers need a better understanding of a worker who does well quarter to quarter but whose performance suddenly drops off. That employee could be suffering from a mental health problem, Fyvie says.

"They need to be taken care of with care and concern, person-toperson, and not in water-cooler conversations," Fyvie says. "If an employee is being supported, they are going to show up for work, show up on time and be happier and more productive."

#### WORKSPORT MOVES TO WEST SENECA, REVS UP HIRING

A company making big moves in the EV industry is moving headquarters from Ontario to West Seneca.

Worksport Ltd., which manufactures pickup-truck bed covers, is building a local presence quickly by broadening its product portfolio. The company manufactures solar panel tonneau covers and is developing partnerships with auto manufacturers.

One partnership is with Hyundai, for which Worksport is creating a solar panel tonneau cover, Worksport CEO Steven Rossi said.

Worksport has a "family of patents" for the solar panel covers, SOLIS, which can provide up to 10 miles of charge. Worksport recently launched the SC4 PRO soft folding tonneau cover, which is sold on the company's e-commerce platform and on Amazon and Walmart.

Those covers will be assembled at Worksport's 220,000-square-foot manufacturing plant at 2500 North America Drive, formerly a Certo Brothers warehouse, for which Worksport paid \$8.2 million.

Manufacturing is currently done in China, but Rossi said the plan is to move that to West Seneca.

The company has 13 local employees, with the goal of adding at least 12 more, including machine operators and mechanics.

"In the next month, we think between 25 and 50 people for one shift," Rossi said. "Within this year, we're really going to try to build out our day shift, and after that, I think then we'll scale to an overnight shift, too."

## T-MARK ACQUISITION FILLS UP NEW BUILDING

#### Jameson Electric deal added 15 employees to existing head count

It's an exciting time for T-Mark Plumbing Heating and Cooling, which moved to a new facility in December and recently acquired an electrical company.

The family-owned business in Kenmore just acquired another family-run company, Jameson Electric Heating & Air Conditioning on Military Road in Kenmore.

The June 1 deal will move Jameson's 15 employees into T-Mark's new space at 577 Englewood Ave.

"We want to be a one-stop place for anything a customer may need for home services," said Ryan Miller, president of T-Mark. "Having that more diversified base of services is good for the customer and good for the employees."

Miller said T-Mark has always had a good relationship with Jameson, which was started about 20 years ago by Jim Williamson. Miller said the company has worked with Jameson and other electrical contracting companies to meet clients' needs, but "by bringing a partner in-house, we knew we'd have a little more control over that customer experience."

Miller's plan initially was to build an electrical division for the company.

"We quickly realized that with the scale and size of our operation, we would need to bring in a partner that had an established team with the licensing and all that," Miller said.

Williamson plans to stay on with the company as the electrical service and installation manager, Miller said.

"We will be able to offer more services in the home and have even greater customer care," Williamson stated in a news release.

Miller's father, Jeff Miller, started T-Mark more than 25



years ago. He remains vice president of the company, though Ryan Miller has been running the company for the last eight years. Ryan's brother, Ben Clement, is operations manager.

Now, with Jameson's 15 employees, the company is up to 96 employees, and Ryan plans to add another eight electricians by year-end.

With that much growth, T-Mark needed a new facility. It had been operating in a 4,000-square-foot building on Elmwood Avenue in Kenmore but was outgrowing it fast.

The Englewood location

Was previously a Kenwood Auto parts store before it sold to NAPA Auto Parts. T-Mark invested about \$1 million in renovations including paving a parking lot, adding drainage and new windows.

T-Mark also owns the adjacent lot, which has a separate 4,000-square-foot warehouse that the company is using for materials storage.

"The focus for the company now is going to be on the proper integration with the electrical division, as we continue to grow all of the divisions," Miller said.



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## Inside the \$36M rebuild of airport runways

It's been more than 40 years since the last substantial rehabilitation of the runways at Buffalo Niagara International Airport.

That's changing. Work is underway to restore and upgrade the air port's main runway. The project will be done in phases and will eventually tackle both runways.

The total price tag is about \$36 million.

"It is well overdue, and it is a comprehensive runway project, where we're doing a lot of the maintenance and modernizing the facility," said Helen Tederous, director of public affairs for the Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority.

Union Concrete is the lead contractor on the project, which includes full-depth reconstruction of the underlying concrete and asphalt replacement.

All the runway lights also need to be replaced. Frey Electric Construction Co. is handling that aspect of the work.

It's a complicated job, said Ron

Solazzo, Frey's project manager for the airport work.

Runway lights need to be installed at the perfect elevation and must exactly match the grade of the runway to ensure they don't interfere with planes.

"There's a ton of coordination that needs to be done," Solazzo said. The runway lights use stainless steel wiring that runs underground. The project will replace the existing incandescent lights with longer-lasting LEDs.

In total, the project will involve installing about 700 lights on both runways.

There are between 10 and 20 Frey

employees working on the project alongside teams of other contractors.

Frey has worked with the NFTA and the airport in the past, including on the major terminal upgrade that was completed in 2021.

"We like to gravitate toward those larger jobs, because we feel that we run them well," said Anthony Sciandra, Frey operations manager.

The NFTA does not start this type of project lightly, Tederous said. Rebuilding one runway means all planes must use the other for the duration of the work, but the change isn't expected to cause flight delays.

Flight paths have been altered, and the NFTA has announced that residents in neighborhoods that don't often see or hear planes will encounter more than usual in the coming months.

"Buffalo has a very short constructions season, as we all know," Tederous said, "so this is something that is just really essential for maintenance and for future goals for the airport."

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**CEO of ACP Tech** talks growth, acquisition

Over the last 26 years, Ben Pearce Sr. has grown his local technology company from a one-man operation to 25 employees, two offices and a satellite location in San Antonio, Texas.

Then this year, ACP Technologies was acquired by Atlantic, Tomorrow's Office, a Manhattan-based manager services provider of office technology solutions and products.

"It really has become winwins for both of us," said Pearce, president and CEO. "It was a very strategic acquisition."

#### How he grew the business

From 2005, ACP Technologies of West Seneca grew revenue every year. Last year's revenue increased by 13% and was the "most profitable year yet," Pearce said.

In a rapidly changing industry, he adjusted the business over the years as needed, standardizing operations and equipment.

The business started in the late '90s as Pearce began consulting for some Norganizations. As the workload grew, he hired his first staff. Back then, the company used a break-fix model, meaning when an IT system broke, he and his team fixed it.

In the mid-2000s, team-managed service providers became more prevalent, and ACP invested in the

tools to shift its business model. The company later adjusted to cloud solutions and added cybersecurity as well.

Pearce standardized equipment, meaning the company only sells a few types of laptops and PCs, which are still "best of breed" but not the most expensive.

"The client understands that we understand how to support things," he said. "It's always the same."

#### How ACP got acquired

There was always a plan for an exit, Pearce said, though that came earlier than expected.

"I think the timing for being acquired was just the stars aligned, and I was presented with Atlantic, who was really the right fit," he said.

The opportunity came from Pearce looking into acquiring a company himself. After losing a deal to another business, it was suggested that Pearce look into the winning company.

That deal didn't work out,

but it did nudge Pearce to look at other companies interested in acquiring ACP. He talked with about six interested businesses and Atlantic was the clear choice, he said.

As of March, ACP is the ninth company acquired by Atlantic, whose growth strategy is IT, cybersecurity, print and imaging services, according to a press release. Acquiring ACP helped Atlantic expand its IT services division.

For ACP, the deal offers ACP employees better work-life balance with more teams who can rotate tasks and more opportunities for career advancements. The acquisition increases technical staff from 25 to 115.

"We have boots on the ground where we were contracting out support to these clients," Pearce said. "Their experience of what and how they engage with us and the expertise ... even the techie things such as response times and solutions we can provide are only going to get better."

## IN DIVERSITY, OPPORTUNITY

Faced with shrinking student pools, declining revenues and pressure to reflect their surrounding populations, community colleges find a powerful tool in DEI efforts

W

hen Aleia Peters graduated from Shadow Creek High School in Pearland, Texas, last month, she finished not only a high school diploma but also an associate degree in general studies. ¶ Thanks to a dual enrollment program at Alvin Community College,

outside of Houston, Peters will be a junior by her second semester at Texas A&M University, her next academic destination. ¶ "It just really prepared me for what college life is going to be like," she said. "Honestly, it was probably one of the best experiences I've ever (had)." ¶ Programs such as dual enrollment pathways have helped community college campuses nationwide become increasingly diverse in recent years, drawing more students from historically underserved groups. Peters, who is Black, was able to shave two years off her journey toward studying biomedical science and going to pharmacy school.



The percentage of non-white students increased an average of 8.89% over the last decade at mid-size, two-year public community colleges nationwide with fall enrollments of 3,700 to 10,000 students, according to a Buffalo Business First analysis of U.S. Department of Education data from 2020-21, the most recent year available.

Only 16 of 289 schools that size – or 5% – failed to increase student body diversity over the last decade.

Student diversity is not only important for equity of higher education access, but it also benefits students overall, who will live and work in a diverse world.

In addition, as schools, especially community colleges, struggle with declining enrollment and revenue trends and a shrinking prospective student pool, they must expand their reach to serve their existing communities, as well as draw in students from outside the area.

At ACC, the percentage of enrollment made up of students of color jumped 22.3% over the last decade – putting the college in the top 5 in our analysis.

"It's all about widening that door, that access," said John Matula, interim vice president of student services at ACC. "The more students we can get in to offer education, the better it is for them and for us."

An emphasis on diversity, equity and inclusion is about more than increasing enrollment. In 2021, the Council for Higher Education Accreditation added a DEI component to its recognition standards, which the organization requires accrediting organizations use when evaluating colleges.

Accreditation is required for schools to participate in any federal financial aid program, according to Kevin Kinser, department head of education policies studies at Pennylvania State University.

"In most states, accreditation is seen as a mark of legitimacy for an institution of higher education," he added.

The changing demographics also reflect similar trends seen with the overall population. In 2010, the probability that two American citizens chosen at random would be from different race and ethnicity groups was about 55%, according to U.S. Census Bureau data. By 2020, that likelihood had increased to 61%.

Educators say recruiting and then retaining diverse populations of students takes intentional, strategic moves on colleges' parts. Administrators across the country pointed to specific programming, hiring diverse faculty and holistic student supports.

#### **Programming that attracts and supports students**

Many community colleges have some type of dual enrollment offering, where high school students can take courses for college credit before graduating. But some are going the extra mile to provide onsite supports and to show participants' return on investments.

ACC and Luzerne County Community College, with its main campus in Nanticoke, Pennsylvania, have programs for high school students to complete an associate degree before they graduate.

The tuition is half the normal rate, so there's a time- and money-saving component, not to mention a head start for students' career and academic paths, luzerne President Thomas Leary said. Early enrolled students make up about 20% of overall enrollment, Leary said, and about onefourth of early enrolled students are people of color.

The school's enrollment was 4,187 during the 2020-21 academic year, based on Department of Education data. The percentage of students of color based on total student population increased about 12.6% over the last decade.

Alvin's total enrollment for the 2020-21 academic year was 4,965 and dual enrollment students make up about 40% of that. Typical tuition is 50% to 75% discounted for the dual enrollment students. Nearly three-quarters of program enrollees are students of color.

Through the program, the college has six full-time advisers embedded in 10 high schools. They offer onsite support while students take classes, the majority of which also take place onsite at the high schools, said Jessica Ranero-Ramirez, Alvin's dean

of college access and partnerships.

While dual enrollment programs aren't typically big revenue boosters for colleges, Alvin's operates in the black, getting assistance from state funding and alleviating operating costs by not having to use its own physical locations to host the program, according to Matula.

The school is adding a bachelor's in business administration, which is expected to launch in fall 2024. That will be the first time in school history that it's offered a four-year degree, giving dual enrollment students who complete an associate degree an option to continue their education at Alvin.

Alvin's Upward Bound Program also helps bring more students into its pipeline with grant-funded assistance for first-generation or low-income college students. The college has about 63 students from Alvin High School each academic year and offers support by being onsite twice a month to help with college, FAFSA and scholarship applications; bringing students to Alvin's campus for added academic help; and holding a free summer program with academic help and a big trip.

The trips in particular show the students different areas, colleges and possibilities, according to Maribel Beasley, program adviser and recruiter. In the past, the group has gone to Tennessee, Missouri and Washington, D.C.

"It's a cultural experience outside of just Texas," she said. "It gives them the chance to explore and not just stop here."

About a year ago, Crafton Hills College, in Yucaipa, California, started placing staff at local high school sites Mondays through Thursdays to help students complete college applications and to provide information on

programs, majors and how to transfer to a four-year school, according to Delmy Spencer, vice president of student services.

The school's total enrollment for the 2020-21 academic year was 5,260, according to Department of Education data, and the percent of minority students based on its total student population jumped by about 16.2% over the last decade.

Acknowledging that retention rates are lower for students if they start college behind academically, Luzerne offers a remediation program for juniors and seniors in high school in math and science. The goal is to improve competency levels in those key areas and then offer subsequent courses where they can earn college credit.

High school and college faculty teach the remediation courses.

"(That's) probably the best design, because then they're sharing information with each other, the faculty and high school teachers," said Leary. "It only expands that partnership."

#### Increasing faculty diversity

As student bodies become more diverse, schools are working to make sure that their faculty reflects those changes. Diverse faculty members bring more perspectives when it comes to decision-making, teaching and individual interactions with students, which helps foster inclusivity.

In 2018, 184,969 (24.4%) of full-time faculty at degree-granting postsecondary institutions were Black, Hispanic, Asian/ Pacific Islander, American Indian/Alaska Native or two or more races, based on Department of Education stats. By 2020, that number had risen to 196,314, or 25.8% of the total faculty population.

Jason Dorsette is chief equity officer and executive director of Linn-Benton Community College's office of institutional equity, diversity & inclusion in Albany, Oregon.

Dorsette, who identifies as a person of color, went to a community college before getting a bachelor's degree and Ph.D. He knows the importance of students' seeing representation among faculty.

"We are very serious about recruiting and retaining faculty and staff of color," he said.

Linn-Benton, which had a total enrollment of 4,190 in 2020-21, started a search advocate program about five years ago to enhance diversity and equity in hiring and onboarding, he said. Its minority student population has increased 9.8% over the last decade.

A search advocate – a person who is trained with equity in mind – is involved in screening, interviewing, evaluating and onboarding new workers and is expected to bring up concerns or challenges during the hiring process.

Before training took place, at least 8% of hires in 2016 and 13.11% in 2017 were from ethnically diverse groups, according to data provided by Linn-Benton. (Appli-

Since the program's training began, those percentages have risen to an average of 24% from 2018 to 2023.

#### Holistic support that helps the whole student

The diversity of a school's student body doesn't increase over time if the institution can't retain students. That involves providing support that extends beyond academics, especially as some underrepresented groups of students historically have added challenges and barriers to education.



For example, Jamestown Community College has a staffed global learning center for its international students and recently added reflection center that students of any faith can use.

For decades, Niagara County Community Col-

lege, or NCCC, has hosted a childcare center on campus. Qualified students can use financial aid and grants to help pay for the offering, said Julia Pitman, vice president of student services.

Both local schools have on-campus

housing, a benefit that not all two-year community colleges offer, and food pantries for in-need students.

Luzerne, in Nanticoke, Pennsylvania, started food banks after faculty noticed some students didn't have the opportunity to have a good meal on campus. So the school started a food market on the main campus. The initiative grew to more sites at the school's seven other locations, according to Leary.

"It's a focus on diversity," he said. "It has to do with an all-inclusive audience to make sure that everybody has the oppor-

## **WNY community colleges** talk strategies to recruit and retain students of color

colleges say efforts like intentional recruitment, new programs and trainings and holistic support services to retain and attract diverse student populations are making a difference.

SUNY Erie, Genesee Community College, Jamestown Community College and Niagara County Community College all Increased the diversity of their Student bodies over the decade.

Business First analyzed local colleges with grand total enroliment of between roughly 4,000 to 10,000 students, looking at the percentage of racial minority student population and how that percentage has changed over the last 10 years. (Grand total enroliment means the total number of students registered at a given school, not full-time equivalent enroliment.) The latest available U.S.

Department of Education data is for the 2020-21 school year.

The diversity of SUNY Erie's student population increased by about 6.4% over the previous decade, according to Department of Education data. NCCC's rose 6.3% over that same period of time; GCC, 5.8%; and JCC, 5.2%.


Here's a look at what some local colleges are doing to increase diversity.

#### Niagara County Community College

In 2007, NCCC created a multicultural coordinator position. Half of the role is dedicated to recruiting underrepresented students through visits downstate and in the Buffalo area. The role also works to create programming to make the college inclusive for students.

"It's a recruiter, bringing diverse students in, but it's also that retention piece," said Julia Pitman, NCCC vice president of student services. "That's one of our keys for recruiting."

Around 2015, NCCC petitioned SUNY and started an educational opportunity program, which aims to help underrepresented populations or those who attend low-performing high schools, Pitman said. Through the program, which can support up to 75, new college students get additional support like summer orientation and success coaches assigned to them to help retain those students. Pitman also pointed to the school's culinary institute that

opened in Niagara Falls in 2012. The project came with a recruitment plan to draw in students outside the Niagara region and outside New York state by positioning the offering as a private institution-type feel with a community college price tag.

The efforts appear to have paid off. As of fall 2022, 28.2% of the institute's students were from under-represented groups, she said.

#### Jamestown Community College

Typically, increasing diverse enrollment of students doesn't happen by chance.

"If we're going to be dependent on enrollment in just our region, demographics spell out it's going to be challenging to maintain, let alone increase, our enrollment," said Kirk Young, JCC vice president of student affairs. "We've been intentional about outreach."

Prior to around 2014, JCC's recruitment efforts were mainly focused regionally. But since then, the school has tapped a recruitment specialist whose job is to draw in students from outside JCC's service region.

JCC also aims to strategically create partnerships with other colleges to boost enrollment, including recruiting and retaining diverse students.

The institution partners with four-year private college St. Bonaventure University for a scholarship for JCC students to get their degrees and then transfer to St. Bonaventure.

JCC also works with SUNY Fredonia where academically ineligible students who applied to the four-year school from certain regions will be referred to the community college when they didn't gain admission to the SUNY school, according to Young. That program has been less active since the pandemic. Additional partnerships are possible.

With parts of JCC's service area seeing an increase in Hispanic population, the institution around 2018 started working with some local high schools to reach underrepresented students earlier on in their college-decisionmaking process.

The college recently got a grant to embed staff in area high schools and hired a director and assistant director to oversee that program.

"We're trying to work with those students much earlier on," Young said.

tunity in a very respectful way to be able to access whatever they need while they're here."



The markets are run by volunteers and began with stock coming from the school's faculty and staff but has expanded to community donations as well.

John Matula Alvin also has different types of student supports in place, such as an emergency fund for stu-

dents if they need extra help getting by in situations ranging from a flat tire to the electricity at home in jeopardy of being turned off. Luzerne County Community College's main campus is in Nanticoke, Pennsylvania.

For the last decade, the college has been using Rice University's library of free textbooks, called OpenStax, and over the past about five years also started using a system the school's dubbed "inclusive access," where they offer cheaper versions of textbooks in a digital format.

Matula said he'd like to have all holis-

tic student supports housed in one center and recently put in a proposal to create a full-time social worker position on campus.

"Being inclusive helps with retainment," said Pitman of NCCC, "because if you feel comfortable where you're living and going to school, you tend to stay and finish up."

Bank aims to attract and retain talent in contemporary space

ith the opening of its second tech hub, M&T Bank is doubling down on downtown.


The bank spent \$24 million to renovate four floors of the Lafayette Court building at 465 Main St. – nearly 100,000 square feet of space. Ciminelli Real Estate, which owns the building, spent an additional \$10 million renovating other parts of the building.

CannonDesign designed the space, and Arc Building Partners is the general contractor.

M&T cut the ribbon on the new M&T Tech hub earlier this month.

Michael Wisler, chief information officer for M&T, said this hub and its sister site at Seneca One are intended to attract and retain top talent. "We believe that citize like Puf

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hub features meeting spaces in all sizes.

relevance is mostly about talent," he said.

Contemporary workers are looking for vibrant live-work-play neighborhoods, and M&T is trying to play a role in creating that environment downtown, Wisler said.

The Lafayette Court offices previously housed many of M&T's tech employees, but they were stuck in a 1980s environment, said Keith Belanger, M&T senior executive vice president for corporate services.

The walls were lined with executive offices, while high cubicles filled the interior. Now employees work in open areas near the building's large windows. The interior is occupied by meeting rooms and private spaces.

Belanger said this project shows the bank's commitment to downtown Buffalo.

"We could have housed this tech hub anywhere," he said,

▲ Rooms are equipped with cameras and screens for remote meetings. "but we didn't want to leave a hole in our downtown."

M&T has invested \$100 million in downtown buildings over the last three years, Belanger said. The bank recently announced it would shutter several suburban offices as it consolidates operations in the city.

"Newer generations, they don't want to sit in a suburban office park," he said.

The new offices are designed to be part of a bustling down-

town neighborhood, said Michael Tunkey, design principal for CannonDesign.

"The whole concept of this space was to make it placebased," he said.

It's also designed to get workers – many of whom have grown accustomed to hybrid work – excited to come back to the office.

"It's tailoring it to the people who are here," said Brian Fiscus, interior architect for CannonDesign. "To make them feel happy, to bring them from their homes and downtown."

Each floor of the four-floor space features a different space for employees to connect and have fun – an arcade, a virtual reality center, a library and a large, open town hall area that can be used for events.

The space has enough room for about 750 employees. M&T plans to house more than 500 employees there initially.

M&T's technology division employees 1,900 employees in Buffalo and Wilmington, Delaware.



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## **SMALL BUSINESS LENDING ENVIRONMENT GETTING TIGHTER**

Lenders are cautiously raising standards for loan applications in many sectors

DAVID FEIDER, Wolters Kluwer **S** mall-business loans are becoming harder to get and more expensive. And that combion is expected to get worse.

nation is expected to get worse. The credit market has been tightening – driven in part by the Federal Reserve's sustained interest rate increases over the last year. New data from the Fed underscores how rapidly the lending ecosystem has worsened for business owners, with 46% of lenders surveyed saying they were tightening standards for commercial and industrial loans in the second quarter. Less than one-quarter of lenders said the same in the third quarter of last year.

For construction loans, 73.8% of lenders were tightening standards. The banking industry also has suffered through several high-profile collapses this year, most notably Silicon Valley Bank, a development that has revealed weaknesses in many banks' balance sheets. Since March 2022, the Federal Reserve has raised its target interest rate from about 0% to about 5% in a bid to tamp down inflation and tame what it saw as a hot job market. Recent data shows the job market remains resilient.

The latest research from the Fed is sobering and supported by oth-

er data, said commercial real estate expert David Feider, lead technology product manager at information and software firm Wolters Kluwer.

While the tightening of lending is typical of a normal business cycle, problems are anticipated when refinancing loans at a time of increased remote work, a unique issue that has the potential to make this cycle more severe, Feider said.

"With respect to commercial real estate, especially office space, I

think it's likely to get worse in the near term, as the factors driving the reduction in demand for office space are not going away anytime soon," he said.

For residential loans, just 1.9% of lenders said they were tightening standards for government-backed mortgages, while 21.6% were tightening jumbo mortgage standards. Meanwhile, 27.5% of lenders were tightening standards for auto loans, and 23.6% for consumer loans.





## What goes into a home appraisal?

home appraisal can seem like a mysterious and opaque process — someone comes to your home, looks around, runs some numbers and sends back a home value that may or may not match up to what you or the county assessor thinks it's worth.

Home appraisal is usually a required element of a bank-financed home sale, and it can be a make-or-break moment for the deal. Here's a look behind the curtain of what appraisers are looking for, according to Ask Angi.

#### **OVERALL HOME CONDITION**

- Obviously, homes in poorer condition value for less.
- Total square footage of the home and property and number of bedrooms and bathrooms
- These fundamental elements provide the baseline for the rest of the appraisal.
- Quality of landscaping

• Well-maintained trees and bushes tend to help home value.

#### **OUTDOOR FEATURES**

- Patios, decks, porches, pathways, fountains and outdoor lighting all increase home value.
- Roof and foundation condition
  Both elements can have massive deal-breaking problems that had not been noticed before, such as a foundation crack or a leaking roof.
- State of lighting, electricity, plumbing, HVAC and appliances
- The condition and age of all these fundamental parts of your home's infrastructure play a big role in the value.
- Number of functional fireplaces. Fireplaces add a certain luxury value to any home.

#### **STATUS OF THE BASEMENT**

The better the basement, the more value it provides. A finished basement adds the most value, but even in an unfinished basement, it's important that it not be moldy or damp.

#### CONDITION OF OTHER FEATURES

Countertops? Home theaters? Nifty stuff like wine cellars or custom built-in furniture? All these things impact home value.

A home appraiser will take this information and then compare it to similar houses in your area, drawing information from recent home sales and prices. All these factors mean that different appraisers might come to different conclusions, so it's OK to ask for a second opinion if the first one seems wrong.

On average, a home appraisal costs about \$350. The initial appraisal inspection can be done in one day, then it will take between seven and 10 days for them to do their comparative research and complete a final report and home value.

When hiring an appraiser, look for

certifications and continuing education. Your lender will probably recommend an appraiser, but you can also hire on your own. Ask if they're experienced in appraising your specific type of property, and make sure they hold the proper licensing, bonding and insurance to work in your state or locality.

Feel free to ask for a list of references from previous clients, and check them. Nothing can replace borrowing a little experience from someone who's worked with the same pro.

It's a good idea to independently verify the certifications and licensing the appraiser provides you with. This is a major job with a big impact on one of the most important purchases of your life, so it's worth taking the extra time to get it right.

Keep all the documentation the appraiser gives to you; you may need it later on.
